The Interim Vice President, Ken Crawford, led a noteworthy discussion concerning the proposed changes to the BNC bylaws. Various attendees asked questions and provided feedback.

Special Item of Interest

The Special Events Chairperson, Linda Burton, responded to questions concerning why the luncheon meeting locations have changed and the rising cost charged for special events. Those in attendance were surprised to hear that facilities we once used have significantly raised their rental fees; essentially pricing us out. Additionally, the location of the monthly meetings

was moved to save BNC from paying a significant insurance premium required by the church where our meetings were previously held. We, also, no longer benefit from the donation of our luncheon food. This has prompted BNC to relocate to where people can order food. The American Legion does not charge for the use of the room and the food charges are very reasonable. The Board works to keep the dues to a minimal even as costs sky rocket and member participation decreases.




